

Covid-19 Catch-Up Funding

Following the extended school closure, Special Schools received £240 per student on roll to use on catching up missed learning and opportunities because of Covid-19.

At Marshfields School, 174 students are on-roll. This led to a grant of £41760. This document sets out the intended expenditure of this fund.

Activity	Intended Purpose	Cost
Ferry Meadows trips for Y8-14	Team building for staff and students. Activity to take place in form groups.	£1100
Peripatetic dance	Dance to add in additional movement and creativity for students in Y5, 6, 7 and P16	£2000
Families First	Support with primary transition.	£5000
ACE	Support older students with college-style learning to ensure they successfully transition to P16 providers at the end of their current year group.	£4500
Maths catch-up	3:1 intervention delivered by a maths specialist to recoup any lost learning in numeracy skills.	£5398
English intervention	3:1 intervention delivered by an English specialist to recoup any lost learning in literacy skills	£6000
Literacy and numeracy support	Y5-7 to receive weekly 1:1 support from a member of the student services team to baseline and address literacy and numeracy skills	£9800
Easter revision clubs	Money set aside to pay teaching staff for additional hours to open over Christmas. This will be actioned if there is no change to the government's plan for exams to go ahead in the summer. These sessions will be vital if Y10-14 students are to sit qualifications successfully.	£2500

Sensory equipment	Y5-8 require a greater level of sensory intervention to access a full school day after the lengthy school closure. A second sensory room has been created to allow permanent, separate sensory input within this pod.	£1500
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
